### WHAT IS FCSS



Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) is an 80/20 funding partnership between the Province and the Town of Redcliff. The program first came to Redcliff on April 1, 1988 and is currently directed by the Redcliff Community Services Department and supported by the FCSS Advisory Board. FCSS provides programs that enhance well-being among individuals, families, and the community.

### FCSS CAN

- Promote social development
- Help citizens maintain their independence
- Promote and encourage volunteerism
- Encourage and facilitate inter-agency/ organizational cooperation
- Provide grant funding to community groups offering services within the scope of the FCSS mandate as resources allow
- Serve as an information and referral source on social service issues
- Advocate and work for positive social change and healthy community development

#### FCSS IS NOT

- Recreational
- Direct assistance, including money, food, clothing or shelter, to sustain an individual or families
- Rehabilitative
- A duplication of services from other **Government Agencies**

#### FCSS BOARD

Family and Community Support Services is guided by an advisory board comprised of 3 – 5 members including a Council member and an alternate. Meetings are held regularly at the call of the chair.

#### Duties include:

- Attending regular meetings
- Maintaining and monitoring community needs
- Creating yearly plans/goals
- Reviewing and evaluating FCSS policies, programs, and agreements
- Allocating grant funds
- Formulating recommendations and presentations to Council

### HOME SUPPORT SERVICES

Home Support Services provide professional quality in-home services. Assistance is available when required due to illness, convalescence, health limitation, and other reasons. Fees are on a sliding scale determined by a client's annual income.

### INCOME TAX **PREPARATION**

Income Tax Preparation is provided by volunteers who assist individuals, families, and seniors in filing income tax returns at various times throughout the months of March and April. There is no charge, but criteria must be met to qualify for this service. Taxes cannot be prepared for the deceased, those who have claimed bankruptcy, self-employed individuals, and those claiming employment, business, or rental expenses.

### **SNOW ANGELS** YARD ANGELS

Volunteers help maintain snow removal and lawn mowing for those that qualify. Subject to volunteer availability.

# WHEELS

**MEALS ON** Hot and nutritionally well-balanced meals are available to eligible adults of any age on a longterm or short-term basis if they meet one or more of the following criteria:

- have difficulty preparing nutritious meals
- convalescing from a hospital stay
- chronic memory impairment
- recent bereavement or loss with no available support system

Lunches are delivered by volunteers from Monday - Friday between 11:15 am and 11:45 am, except on holidays. (Meals for the weekend are delivered on Friday.)

This service is subsidized by the Town of Redcliff and is available to you at a cost of \$7 per meal (subject to change). If credit is approved, fees are billed on a monthly basis and paid at the Redcliff Town Office or online. Call 403-5483232 for information or pick up an application in person.
