Council Meeting held February 8, 2010

A) Councillor Solberg moved the minutes of the Council Meeting held February 8, 2010, be adopted as presented. – Carried.

Operations Committee meeting held February 16, 2010

B) Councillor Solberg moved the minutes of the Operations Committee meeting held February 16, 2010 be received for information. – Carried.

Aquatic Centre Project

i) D. Schaffer, Public Services Director was in attendance to discuss the Aquatic Centre Project. It was noted that the electrical grounding panel will be included in the \$153,000.00 and will not require additional funds. It was further noted that the target completion date is for June, based on an early decision and timely approval of the MSI grant application profile.

Councillor Solberg moved to concur with the recommendation of the Operations Committee that Western Recreation be awarded the contract for the Aquatic Centre Project to supply and install the play structure model 146, and supply and install Delifol liner, supply and install an electrical grounding panel at a cost of \$153,000.00 (plus GST); conditional to Municipal Sustainability Initiative (MSI) grant funding profile being approved. — Carried.

Landscaping - Eastside

ii) In regard to the proposed Landscaping – Eastside the Municipal Secretary noted that a map of the golf course lease area was provided to Council. It is her understanding that the Riverview Golf Club plans to install a driving range with netting and the proposed landscaping may encroach into the area proposed for the driving range. D. Kilpatrick noted that the landscaping will extend south perpendicular to Redcliff Way. Further that no asphalt path will be constructed until a later date. Concerns were expressed that there may not be enough space between the proposed netting and the rear fence of the adjacent properties to allow the construction of a pathway to connect up with future trails along the escarpment. The Municipal Secretary noted that she has received negative comments regarding the proposed driving range and netting from prospective lot purchasers. The Municipal Treasurer advised that the proposed new landscaping project in Eastside Phase 1 adjacent to Mitchell Street will require submission of an MSI grant funding profile for approval.

Councillor Nunweiler moved to concur with the recommendation of the Operations Committee as amended that the landscaping of 9th Avenue SE include the option for plain asphalt. Further that the 9th Avenue SE landscaping project be deferred to a future year when the development along 9th Avenue SE has progressed to the point where the Town can complete the project without risk of removal of landscaping for the installation of driveways along the boulevard. Further that the funds in the 2010 budget to construct landscaping on 9th Avenue SE be reallocated to construct a park along Mitchell Street adjacent to Eastside Phase 1, as proposed, excluding an asphalt trail, which will be constructed at a later date and be located over the storm water line on the western edge of the park, conditional to Municipal Sustainability Initiative (MSI) grant funding profile being approved. - Carried.

Main Street South (Broadway to 5th Avenue) Road Rehabilitation Project

iii) Councillor Kilpatrick moved to concur with the recommendation of the Operations Committee that the Town proceed with advertising the Request For Proposal (RFP) for the design of Main Street South (from Broadway to 5th Avenue), including Avenues. Further that the Local Improvement Bylaw and Borrowing Bylaw be delayed until the design work and the geotechnical work are completed to determine a cost sharing between the Town and the affected landowners. – Carried.

Broadway Avenue East (Trans Canada Highway Avenue to Boundary Road) Road Rehabilitation Project

iv) Councillor Solberg moved to concur with the recommendation of the Operations Committee that Broadway Avenue East (Trans Canada Highway to Boundary Road) Road Rehabilitation Project should not include a provision to increase the width of Broadway Avenue East to four lanes; however there shall be taper/flaring on the west side of Broadway Avenue at the intersection with Boundary Road to accommodate transition from four lanes in Medicine Hat. Further that the north side of Broadway Avenue East include a curb with two options for costing the installation: 1) curb only and 2) curb with sidewalk. Further that the south side of Broadway not include a curb and the existing drainage ditch be retained, as amended. - Carried.
