Council Meeting held May 10, 2010

A) Councillor Brown moved the minutes of the Council Meeting held May 10, 2010 be adopted as amended. – Carried.

Subdivision and Development Appeal Board hearing held May 6, 2010

B) Councillor Solberg moved the minutes of the Subdivision and Development Appeal Board hearing held May 6, 2010 be received for information. – Carried.

Operations Committee Meeting held May 18, 2010

C) Councillor Steinke moved the minutes of the Operations Committee Meeting held May 18, 2010 be received for information. – Carried.

Stantec Invoicing
Re: Eastside pedestal costs

i) Manager of Engineering was in attendance to discuss Stantec invoicing of Eastside pedestal costs. In regard to the recommendation of the Operations Committee that the Engineering Department negotiate with the City of Medicine Hat for payment of the invoice for pedestal costs, he commented that Stantec should be responsible to negotiate with the City of Medicine Hat as they are the Engineering Consultant for the project or they should absorb the costs. There should be no cost to the Town of Redcliff.

Councillor Brown moved to concur with the recommendation of the Manager of Engineering that Stantec, being the Engineering Consultant for the project, be responsible for negotiations with the City of Medicine Hat for reimbursement of costs in the amount of \$14,511.00 (including GST) relating to modification and adjustment of pedestals in Eastside Phase 1. Further that if Stantec is unsuccessful in negotiating reimbursement from the City of Medicine Hat that Stantec be responsible for the costs. - Carried.

Industrial Drive Road Rehabilitation

ii) Councillor Brown moved to concur with the recommendation of the Operations Committee that the Town Engineer and Genivar meet with the property owners on Industrial Drive to perform a site visit and review the proposed repairs and discuss design modification options for the Industrial Drive Road Rehabilitation project and report to a future Council meeting. – Carried.

Lane Reconstruction 100 Block between 4th & 5th Street NE

iii) Councillor Solberg moved to concur with the recommendation of the Engineering Technician that the Town of Redcliff increase the budget for the Lane Reconstruction project on the 100 Bock between 4th and 5th Street NE by \$17,000.00 plus GST an increase from \$97,000.00 to \$114,000.00 plus GST to be funded from the AMIP grant as outlined in the 2010 Capital Budget. – Carried.

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Eastside Park Landscaping

iv) In regard to Eastside Park Landscaping, Councillor Brown requested clarification of the discussion concerning pumping of water from the Golf Course pond to Pond C in Eastside. Councillor Kilpatrick advised that in the rare occasion when there is no water in Pond C to irrigate the park, there may be consideration for pumping raw water from the golf course pond, however there may be other options such as using a water hydrant to pump water into Pond C, and options would be reviewed at that time. Councillor Kilpatrick expressed concerns that there is no indication of what size of pump is proposed. He felt that if the proposal included a large pump that consideration could be given to install a smaller pump initially and a larger pump could be installed at a later date, when there would be a need.

Councillor Solberg moved to concur with the recommendation of the Operations Committee to proceed with Option 1 including the Installation of Irrigation pump at Eastside Pond C. Further that the Town of Redcliff increase the budget for the Eastside Park Landscaping irrigation project by \$28,000.00 plus GST, an increase from \$200,000.00 plus GST to be funded from MSI grant as approved in the 2010 budget at a total cost of \$228,000.00 plus GST. The additional funding in the amount of \$28,000.00 to be provided from an MSI grant or Land Development Reserve. — Carried.

Municipal Planning Commission meeting held May 19, 2010

D) Councillor Brown moved the minutes of the Municipal Planning Commission meeting held May 19, 2010 be received for information. – Carried.

Policy 54 – Rates Policy Re: Assessment Complaint Fees

A) Councillor Solberg moved to authorize Administration to amend Policy 54 – Rates Policy, Assessment Complaint Fees as presented. – Carried.

Chris Czember & Saamis Rotary Club Re: Request for reduction in Rec-Tangle Rental fee A) Councillor Solberg moved correspondence from Chris Czember and Saamis Rotary Club dated May 6, 2010 requesting that the rental fee for the Rec-Tangle for June 17, 18 and 19, 2010 be reduced to one day rental at \$350.00 be approved. — Carried,

V. Pancoast Re: Naming prominent building, park or place for Walter King B) In regard to the letter from V. Pancoast requesting that a prominent building, park or place be named for Walter King, it was noted that Walter King was known for his teaching in the Town of Redcliff. It was suggested that consideration be given for naming a future school or the road in front of the School for Walter King.

Councillor Brown moved correspondence from V. Pancoast received on May 18, 2010 requesting that the Town of Redcliff

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name a prominent building, park or place for Walter King be received for information. Further that the name Walter King be considered for the naming of a future school or the Street in front of the school. Further that Walter King's name will be added to the street naming list for future consideration. - Carried.

Developing Redcliff Educational and Mental Health Supports (DREAMS) Re: Request for swimming day passes

C) Councillor Brown moved the request from Developing Redcliff Educational and Mental Health Supports (DREAMS) dated May 20, 2010 requesting a donation of 40 swimming day passes at a value of \$75.00 to be used as part of the RAD Positive Ticketing Campaign be approved. - Carried.

Alberta Transportation Re: Federal Gas Tax Funding (FGTF) funding for 2010 and beyond Integrated Community Sustainability Plan confirmation is required

A) Councillor Brown moved Development Permit Application 10-DP-043, Lot 8-11, Block 107, Plan 1117V (118 3rd Street NE) Development in Direct Control District to replace a garage door be approved as presented. - Carried.

Assessment Review Board

B) J. Steinke advised that he attended both courses in regard to training for Assessment Review Boards. He advised that all members of an Assessment Review Board will require training. During discussion at the courses it was suggested that Assessment Review Boards include members at large. It was noted that at the present time not all of the member of the Town of Redcliff Assessment Review Board have had an opportunity to take training. The Acting Municipal Manager advised that it is her understanding that training will be provided for people who are currently on the waiting list that could not be accommodated at the recent courses.

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The Municipal Treasurer commented that as not all Assessment Review Board members have received training the Town may have to consider hiring or exchanging trained Board members in the interim. It was suggested that consideration should also be given to forming a Regional Assessment Review Board with members from various communities. It was further noted that it is likely that a Regional Board could not be formed until 2011 and would require discussion with communities that would be interested in participating on a regional board.

Councillor Nagel moved the verbal report regarding Assessment Review Board update presented by Councillor Steinke be received for information. – Carried.

C) Acting Municipal Manager advised Council that due to health issues of the web designer the launch of the new website will be delayed. We are currently reviewing the progress of the website design with the company awarded the contract.

Councillor Solberg moved the verbal report regarding the status of the Website project presented by Acting Municipal Manager be received for information. – Carried.

D) In regard to the Intermunicipal Development Plan the Acting Municipal Manager advised that Cypress County and the City of Medicine Hat have reached or are close to reaching an agreement and are ready to proceed with second reading of the proposed Intermunicipal Development Plan. Further that J. Hughes from the City of Medicine Hat will review the IDP for changes. It was the consensus of Council that Bylaw 1616 be included on the agenda for the June 28, 2010 Council meeting for second reading.
