  - 3. The Group Home shall have a limit of 4 occupants.
  - 4. Any resident having a history of a conviction for a crime against another person must not have committed that crime within the past decade; and if a crime is committed while a tenant they shall be removed from the premises immediately.
- 5. No person on the Child Registry is permitted.- Carried.
- B) In regard to parking on a boulevard in the Town of Redcliff the Municipal Manager advised that parking on a boulevard is prohibited in the Highway Safety Act, which supersedes any Town of Redcliff bylaw or permit; however, the act did allow for some concessions. The Municipal Manager further recommended that this type of arrangement would set a precedent that would be difficult to overcome and administer.

Councillor Kilpatrick moved the request dated February 8, 2011 from Phil Monteith requesting permission to rent or obtain a yearly permit to park an RV trailer on a portion of the Boulevard on 4th Avenue on the north side of his residence located at 402 6<sup>th</sup> Street SE be denied. – Carried.
