4. STAFF RECOMMENDATION

- 1. 1st Avenue SE (1st Street to 6th Street) Rehabilitation, in the amount of \$172,996.78 plus GST.
- 2. 4th Avenue SE (Mid 000 Block to 5th Street, excludes 2nd Street SE & 4th Avenue Intersection), in the amount of \$183,469.62 plus GST.
- 3. 4th Avenue & 2nd Street SE Intersection Rehabilitation, in the amount of \$14,608.76 plus GST
- 4. Hydrant and Valve replacements (various locations), in the amount of \$162,475.49 plus GST.
- 5. Mitchell Street SE (000 300 Block) including Birch, Elm & Willow Courts, in the amount of \$312,597.44.
- 6. 1st Street & 2nd Avenue SE Intersection, in the amount of \$14,184.29 plus GST.
- 7. 6th Street & 5th Avenue SE Intersection, in the amount of \$14,349.29 plus GST.
- 8. 3rd Street & 6th Avenue SE Intersection, in the amount of \$18,397.31 plus GST.
- 9. 2nd Avenue SE (Mid 000 Block to 6th Street) in the amount of \$146,210.79 plus GST.

Further Provisional item (2nd Street and 8th Avenue SE Intersection) with a total cost of \$13,496.75 plus GST be approved and funded from Curbs, Gutters and Storm Reserve. Total Engineering cost including geotechnical onsite and Quality Assurance (QA) and survey of \$32,420.00 plus GST be accepted.

1st Avenue SE (1st Street to 6th Street) project to be funded as outlined in 2011 budget using MSI grant, 4th Avenue SE (mid 000 Block to 5th Street) to be funded using MSI grant, Mitchell Street SE (000 – 300 block) including Birch, Elm & Willow Courts to be funded using BMTG (SIP) grant and private contributions, Hydrant and Valve replacements (various locations) using operating funds, 1st Street and 2nd Avenue SE Intersection and 6th Street & 5th Avenue SE Intersection using Curbs, Gutters and Storm (CGS) Reserve. 3rd Street & 6th Avenue SE Intersection, a budget amount of \$21,300.00 be approved and funded using Basic Municipal

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Transportation Grant (BMTG) Street Improvement Program (SIP) grant.

Further that the motion of April 25, 2011 stating "Councillor Solberg moved to authorize Administration to proceed with the Town's portion of the Road Rehabilitation Project on 3rd Street SE as it relates to 1st Avenue and 6th Avenue Intersections, at an estimated cost of \$115,000.00 to be funded from Municipal Sustainability Initiative (MSI) Grant with remaining funds to come from the Other Capital Projects Reserve" be rescinded. – Carried.
