BACKGROUND:

On November 25, 2019 Council gave first reading to the proposed Bylaw 1896/2019 Land Use Bylaw amendment – amendment to rezone properties from H – Horticultural to R-1 Single Family Residential District (*Reference: Council Motion 2019-0445*). Administration advertised the proposed Land Use Bylaw Amendment and public hearing and notified the property owner and adjacent landowners. At the time of preparing this Request for Decision no comments or concerns had been received.

The following background information was provided at the November 25, 2019 Council meeting:

On March 15, 2019, Redcliff Town Council adopted the new Municipal Development Plan (MDP). The MDP identifies this area as being in the **Urban Rejuvenation**. The MDP envisions that this area will continue to transition to a greater proportion or residential use, while maintaining a mixture or uses, including horticultural and commercial.

The proposed Land Use Bylaw amendment was presented to the Municipal Planning Commission at the regularly scheduled meeting on November 20, 2019 for comment. MPC's comments are as follows:

October to December in review

October-

Cypress County council voted to postpone a rezoning decision on a Oct. 1 after a public hearing for a proposed \$250-million EDF Renewable until there is more information provided to council on decommissioning of the project and who is responsibility for its liabilities.

The 201.6 megawatt, 48 turbine project was asking for an overlay of the Wind Energy Facility District for the use and activity of wind turbines and other infrastructure. The reclassification would allow for agriculture activities on each parcel. The overlay was later passed at the Oct. 16 council meeting.

The Eagle Butte Talons cross country team won their 15th zone title in 16 seasons on their home track at Echodale on Oct. 9.

County Council heard the opposition for the proposed Dunmore Equestrian Centre's indoor riding arena from Willowbend Equestrian and Forsyth Ranch Arena on Oct. 16.

"It's a significant threat to our livelihood," said Christine Ziegenhagel of Willowbend Equestrian.

"How can we compete with a facility that is being publicly funded? Our horse boarding clients are wonderful people who make sacrifices to provide for their horses long-term. However, please consider this, if the Dunmore Equestrian Centre offers all types of equestrian activities on site such as clinics, school programs, 4-H clubs, horse clubs like they've been doing and offers year round boarding for similar fares to what we charge,

will our clients not tire of trailing their horses back and forth from our barn to the centre and back?"

"Every dollar counts and for the average horse owner it would be much more efficient to board their horses where the activity is at. This is taking away from our revenues as a small business in Cypress County."

Morley Forsyth of the Forsyth Ranch Arena says he is in the equine programming industry because he loves working with kids.

"I've put a lot of hard work and sweat into it," said Forsyth.

"I've had to put money into it to keep it going and it's finally taking off. The Dunmore Equestrian Centre with some of the stuff they've already done has taken some business from me.

"I have worked with them and I enjoy working with them. They've raised some horses from me on some therapy programs and have been successful."

Cypress County voted to step up and advocate for HALO in hopes of finding some stable funding for the medical helicopter service.

County Coun. Robin Kurpjuweit says this will now provide the opportunity to assess the provincial budget and work with the province, HALO and other municipalities that are affected by the service to come up with a program that gives the air ambulance the support they need.

Grade 12 Eagle Butte High School student Emily Stock was the first student pilot to fly in the inaugural Dave Rozdeba South Alberta Flight Academy. She was able to fly because she had her private pilot's

license. November

Cypress County opt out of providing funding support for the PRSDproposed Dunmore arena/ training facility. It was felt among county councillors and administration that following a year involving both a provincial and federal election and facing the reality that effects the way counties are funded, that it was necessary to go through the finalization of deliberation on the PRSD partnership and their request for \$5 million from the county.

"At this time, we feel we are responsible to protect the county and our ratepayers by not committing to spending on projects when funding sources are in question,' said Dan Hamilton, Cypress County reeve.

"We are aware of provincial initiatives that will likely change our outlook on spending on non-essential or non strategic projects. And until we know how these are going to roll out, we need to sit tight."

It was following the public consultation process that there was a high interest of public support for the facility, but details surrounding the funding and the future business park concept neighbouring the centre, still need to be worked out.

"Council recognizes the need to diversify and grow our tax base. The equestrian centre potentially addresses a desire of many of our rate payers, while aiding council's strategy vision to attract development to the county, further diversifying our base," said Hamilton.

TOWN OF REDCLIFF BYLAW NO. 1751/2013

A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF REDCLIFF for the purposes of authorizing the issuance of Encroachment Permits.

WHEREAS, it is deemed expedient and proper for a Council to authorize the issuance of an Encroachment Permit.

NOW THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF REDCLIFF, IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA DULY ASSEMBLED ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

TITLE

1. This Bylaw shall be known as the Encroachment Permit Bylaw.

ENCROACHMENT PERMITS

- 2. Encroachment permits:
 - a) where the encroaching structure does not encroach more than .31 metres onto Town of Redcliff Property the request for an encroachment permit may be approved by the Municipal Manager and such approval shall be copied to Council for information only;
 - where the encroaching structure does encroach more than .31 metres onto Town of Redcliff Property the request for an encroachment permit shall be forwarded to Council for consideration.
- 3. The fee for an encroachment permit shall be in the amount of \$100.00 plus GST for each encroachment permit issued.
- 4. Prior to the issuance of an encroachment permit the Town of Redcliff will require the owner of an encroaching structure to make application for an encroachment permit on the standard form as shown on Schedule "A" attached to this Bylaw and provide a copy of a Real Property Report (RPR) prepared by an Alberta Land Surveyor, or other acceptable survey identifying the encroachment.
- 5. The information that will be required prior to processing an encroaching permit shall include:
 - a) indemnification of Town of Redcliff from any damage or liability associated with the encroaching structure;
 - b) indemnification of Town of Redcliff for any damages that may occur to the encroaching structure resulting from the need to maintain or construct in the area of the encroachment;
 - c) removal of the encroaching structure, at no cost to the Town of Redcliff, should in the opinion of the Town of Redcliff such structure has become dilapidated;
 - removal of the encroaching structure, at no cost to the Town of Redcliff, should the Town of Redcliff need access to the encroached upon area in the event of utility maintenance, new utility construction or road development.

 - the terms and conditions on the encroachment permit to be issued are identical to the encroachment permit issued to the vendor;

In August, our government provided \$597 million in interim Municipal Sustainability Initiative (MSI) funding to help municipalities and Metis Settlements move forward with their local priorities.

I am pleased to confirm the additional \$74 million in MSI capital funding announced as part of Budget 2019. Combined with the interim funding, municipalities and Metis Settlements will have access to \$671 million in MSI funding, \$641 million under the capital component and \$30 million under the operating component.

For the Town of Redcliff, the additional MSI capital funding is \$75,222; \$36,532 under the MSI component and \$38,690 under the Basic Municipal Transportation Grant (BMTG) component. When added to the MSI capital funding of \$789,882 committed through the Interim Supply in August 2019, your municipality's total capital funding for program year 2019 is \$865,104. Your municipality's MSI operating funding for 2019 remains unchanged at \$51,391.

The Future of MSI

Our government committed to helping municipalities meet their infrastructure needs with predictable, long-term funding, and Budget 2019 fulfills this commitment.

In 2020, capital funding will be \$963 million (including MSI Capital and BMTG). This represents a 9 per cent reduction from the previous provincial budget. In 2021, capital funding will be \$897 million (including MSI Capital and BMTG). This represents a 14 per cent reduction from the previous provincial budget. In both years, MSI Operating will be \$30 million.

Local Government Fiscal Framework

The Local Government Fiscal Framework replaces the MSI program (including BMTG) beginning in 2022. It includes new legislation passed as part of this year's budget, which determines how much capital funding the province must provide to municipalities every year. The framework also includes \$30 million in annual operating funding, though this is not legislated.

In 2022, municipalities will receive \$860 million in capital funding. Calgary and Edmonton will share \$455 million, and other municipalities will share \$405 million.

In following years capital funding will change depending on changes in provincial revenue, which means that municipalities will share in the success of the province. The funding amount will be published two years in advance. For example, the province is legally required to publish the funding amount for 2023 on or before September 30, 2021. Predictable funding will make it easier for municipalities to plan for the future and fulfill planning requirements.

Our government is proud to support municipalities through the Local Government Fiscal Framework, and I will be seeking municipal support in the next steps of this important work. This will include developing a formula to distribute the funding among municipalities, and determining the administrative elements of the program including project eligibility, and application and reporting requirements.

I understand that provincial support is critical for Albertans to receive the infrastructure and services they expect. Working together, as partners, we can ensure these needs are met and set the course for a prosperous future.

Dear Mayor Kilpatrick,

As you may know, the assessment models for wells, pipelines and machinery and equipment, which are used to determine the assessed values of these assets for taxation purposes, have not been updated since 2005. Over the past year, Municipal Affairs has been working on a review of the assessment models to ensure new technology is accounted for, current cost structures and industry practices are reflected, and result in a fair and transparent relative distribution of taxation.

The technical phase of the assessment model review, which included input from working groups of external subject matter experts, has now concluded. The initial results from the technical phase of the review indicate potentially significant shifts in assessment. As assessment changes can have consequential impacts to both municipalities and the oil and gas industry, I have determined additional engagement with industry and municipal associations is required before any final determinations are made.

Our aim is to ensure any changes resulting from the assessment model review do not have an adverse impact on the competitiveness of our energy sector or the viability of our rural municipalities. It is my intention this more robust stakeholder engagement be carried out in early 2020, with final decisions on the assessment model review to be made in spring. As a result, the changes to the assessment models will need to be deferred until the 2021 municipal tax year.

In the absence of new assessment models, assessment year modifiers (AYMs) need to be established for the 2020 tax year. These modifiers are similar to a consumer price index, and are used to adjust the property assessments for regulated industrial property from the base cost year in order to reflect current values. To support the budgeting process municipalities are undertaking, attached are the approved AYMs for the 2019 Assessment Year (2020 Tax Year).



Studies

Inflow and Infiltration Study

The Town's sanitary sewer model is now calibrated. The model can be used to identify and quantify for dry weather flow. Work continues to simulate the July 2013 event. The model is confirming that the biggest issue is inflow.

Water Distribution Study

The Town's water model has been moved over to software that the Town already owns and uses. The model has been debugged and is being used to model fire flows to Lot 5, Block A, Plan 0211147. Preliminary modeling has shown that the Town cannot deliver the fire flows listed in our standards north of the highway.

Capital Projects

3rd and 3rd Lift Station Upgrades

Pumping of groundwater has stopped. Backfilling is likely done until the spring thaw. The concrete access hatch is scheduled to be completed in January 2020, weather permitting. The Overflow from the lift station to the surge tank is installed and the surge tank will fill during high inflows. The outlet from the surge tank to the lift station was not installed due to unstable soil conditions mostly related to the slopes being open so long and the coming of winter weather. Several options will be evaluated for the connection and a decision will be made on the best approach. Project will wrap up in the spring of 2020 with surface restoration.

Rec-Tangle Parking Lot Improvements

All underground work is completed. All work is suspended until spring.

Broadfoot and Stone Place SW, Drainage and Road Improvements

The underground work and patching the road is completed. The weeping tile installation and top lift is Transit Paving's project and has been deferred to the spring of 2020 to allow them to focus on the Rec-Tangle project. The project is expected to come in on budget.

Backup Generator Project

The Backup Generator Project has been started and the detailed design for the RCMP building is 75% complete. A concrete pad has been poured for the generator which will allow the generator to be placed at any time and makes the project no longer weather dependent. Construction planned when funding is made available.

Jesmond Lift Station Upgrade

Council approved upgrading at the Jesmond Lift Station. It has been determined that if the force main is extended from Broadfoot Place to Main Street on 5th Avenue that the project to upgrade the overcapacity sanitary sewer in Broadfoot Place, from Broadfoot Place to Sangster Crescent between four houses, and on Sangster Crescent to Main Street, can be eliminated. The estimated cost to upgrade the sewer line is \$450,000 and the estimated cost to extend the force main by boring is \$45,000. This cost savings is made possible by the upgraded pumps that are planned to be installed in the Jesmond Lift Station. River Valley Potable Water project by the end of January 2020

Eastside Sewage Surge Tanks

Design is 60% complete. The design has changed to follow the 9th Avenue ROW and use a large 3.0 metre diameter pipe as a surge tank. This plan has a number of benefits including reducing the footprint of land sterilized by the surge tanks, sanitary lines required to service the surge tanks will also provide sanitary sewer services for future Eastside development and cost savings. The current design also works with any of the proposed future servicing concepts for the Town so the requirement to finish the sanitary sewer servicing report before building the surge tanks is not necessary.

River Valley Potable Water

The design drawings are 95% completed for this project. It is planned to tender the River Valley Potable Water project by the end of January 2020.

The Transportation Association of Canada put on a webinar on the Traffic Calming Curbs that the City of Calgary is using. Attached is the PowerPoint presentation for your information.

The primary advantage of the Traffic Calming Curbs is that they allow a municipality to test traffic calming before they invest in expensive retrofits. In some cases, the Traffic Calming Curbs work well enough that there is no need for an expensive retrofit.

There are a couple of suppliers of these curbs in the City of Calgary.

The Town plans to purchase some of these curbs and install them in the spring to test traffic calming measures at several locations prior to retrofitting these locations immediately. Initial locations are:

- Main Street between 5th Avenue and 9th Avenue where it is planned to improve the road alignments with traffic calming measures after the utility work planned in 2021 is completed.
- Broadway Avenue and 6th Street where Public Services has planned to install bump outs to improve pedestrian crossings of Broadway.




REDCLIFF/CYPRESS REGIONAL LANDFILL 2019 VS 5 YEAR AVERAGE TO DECEMBER 31, 2019

Canceled Programs


If a program is canceled by the Town all registrants will be contacted and notified. At that time registrants have the choice of a full refund or can apply the payment to another program or session.

Registrant Cancellation

Cancellation of program bookings by the registrant may result in a \$15.00 cancellation fee.

Facility Cancellation

All cancellations of facilities may incur a \$15.00 cancellation fee and must be confirmed with the Community and Protective Services Department, a minimum of ten (10) working days in advance, with the exception of the Aquatic Centre and Ball Diamonds when three (3) days' notice is sufficient. Failure to provide this notice may result in forfeiture of deposit or refund of facility rental fee.



FIRE ALARM SYSTEM In Your Home?

If you have an alarm company monitoring your residence it is up to you to contact them when/if you inadvertently set the alarm off cooking or showering etc. Alarm companies will automatically call the fire department unless they hear from the owner/ occupant within the allotted time. They may call you but not until after they have called us.

The Redcliff Volunteer Firefighters responded to 56 false alarm calls from alarm systems in the last year.

Bylaw 1660/2010 allows for homeowners to be charged when emergency services have responded to over 2 false alarms at an address in one year. Help save the volunteer responder's time and taxpayer dollars by calling your alarm company to cancel emergency response when you know it is not needed.



4th Street SE Rehabilitation – East side of I.F. Cox Elementary School

Construction is well underway replacing existing deteriorating sanitary and water infrastructure. It is anticipated that this project will be complete by Fall 2019.

3rd Street & 3rd Avenue NW Lift Station

The surge tank is complete and tied into the lift station. Backfilling is mostly complete and will be finished in the spring along with the landscaping. The surge tank is designed to store high peak wet weather flows that exceed the short-term pumping capacity of the lift station and greatly reduces the potential for sewer back-ups upstream of the lift station.

Rec-Tangle Parking Lot Rehabilitation

131 1 Street SW

The parking lot is open for use. In the spring concrete work will be competed, the parking lot will be paved, and landscaping done..

Jesmond Lift Station Improvements and Surge

Tank Installation – Lot IMR, Block A, Plan 0412564

The project is to rehabilitate the existing lift station to extend its usable life, improve reliability, and address the odor issues. Project will see the addition of a control building, back up generator and surge tank. This project is slated to begin in the Spring of 2020.

Stone Place SW and Broadfoot Place SW Road Rehabilitation

Installation of the new storm line and catch basins has been completed.

In Spring the following work will be done: installation of weeping tile, repairs to broken concrete, adjustments of gutters to promote drainage, repair of road soft spots, and paving a new top course of Asphalt.

River Valley Potable Water Distribution

This project includes installing new potable water mains and two fire hydrants to connect residents in the River Valley to the Town's potable water system. This project will be completed using a Local Area Improvement Plan, meaning the project is funded by the Town and benefitting owners in the River Valley. This project is slated to begin in the spring of 2020.

East Side Surge Tank

This project includes installation of new sewer main and surge tank. The tank is designed to store wet weather peak flows from the Towns sanitary sewage collection system to reduce the potential of sewer backups on 9th Avenue SE, discharges of untreated sewage to the environment and to reduce peak flows to the sanitary sewer gate with the City that has created some restrictions on new development in the Town. The project is anticipated to begin in the spring of 2020.

Did you know many SMALL PROJECTS REQUIRE DEVELOPMENT & BUILDING PERMITS prior to starting work?

- Projects that require a Development and Building Permit are:
- Temporary Above ground swimming pools greater than 600mm (24" deep)
- Hot tubs
- Movable garden sheds over 10 m2 (107ft2)
- Temporary garage structures (tents)
- Tents requiring a building permit

The Town of Redcliff & Park Enterprises appreciate that many of these projects have a very small project value. We have worked together to develop new Small Project Fees to encourage everyone to be compliant with the Alberta Safety Codes Act and the Town of Redcliff Land Use Bylaw.

Small projects are defined as:

- Projects valued at less than \$2,500 on private residential property or on PS – Public and Semi Public Service District, P – Park and Recreation District or UR – Urban Reserve District
- Must be an accessory structure
- Structures less than 15 m2 (161 ft2), or a tent that is a temporary structure less than 21 m2 (226 ft2)

For small projects: Development Permit Fee \$25.00 Building Permit Application Fee \$55.00

Before starting your project, contact the Development Officer at 403-548-9231 or visit the Planning & Engineering Department in Town Hall # 1 – 3rd Street NE to discuss requirements!

BALL DIAMONDS


There are 4 ball diamonds including a little league diamond and a concession available for rent.

Winter Road Maintenance

The Public Services Department is responsible for the winter road maintenance. Their goal is to provide a level of service that will prevent or reduce accident or injury to residents, to reduce the economic losses to the community, and to facilitate the response to emergencies by Police, Fire, and Ambulance services. Winter road maintenance activities include application of sand or sand/salt combinations when driving conditions deteriorate plus plowing and removal of snow to selected roadways. The primary goal during any snowstorm is to keep primary and collector streets open and safe for the motoring public. Priority is given to Emergency Routes, School Zones and the Downtown Commercial Area. For more detailed information please refer to the Town of Redcliff Sanding and Snow Clearing of Streets Procedure No. 020 (2009).

Snow Removal Policy 36

In an effort to streamline snow clearing and sanding operations, declared snow routes during events that exceed 10cm will request residents to move their vehicles from Broadway Ave E, Broadway Ave W, Broadway Ave NE, Main St South, Mitchel St SE, Redcliff Way SE., 9th St NW, 9th St SW, 1st St NE, and South Railway Dr. Please remove your vehicles from the roadway to assist in clearing operations. Declared snow routes will be advertised on the electronic sign on Broadway Ave., Social Media, and at Town Hall. Preventing Water Service Lines from Freezing

This winter, take extra notice to help prevent your water service lines from freezing in the later winter months (Feb/Mar).

The best way to prevent your water service line from freezing is to keep a tap running lightly in a kitchen

or bathroom. In doing this there is a consumption charge, however this cost is minor when compared to emergency



repairs to private property to repair a frozen service line. In addition, ensuring adequate air flow in your utility room, as well as placing a small electric heater to ensure your pipes stay above freezing is highly recommended. Concrete has no insulation value and water that isn't moving can guickly freeze if the frost is close enough to your water service line. While the Town does respond to calls, the Town also recommends calling local plumbing businesses as some may have the tools necessary to alleviate a frozen water line. If you've noticed Town crews in your area, there is a good chance your property could also be susceptible to water line freezing issues and taking proactive steps not only ensures you have a flowing water service to your residence but can also prevent costly repairs.

Reminders for Residents

- Residents are responsible to clear snow from sidewalks within 24 hrs of snowfall. Snow, or other materials, originating from private property CANNOT be put onto the street.

- When driving near snow clearing operations, residents are also asked to stay 10 meters away from snow clearing, sanding and hauling equipment at all times. Keeping a safe distance away from equipment will assist Town Staff in performing their jobs efficiently and safely.

- It is always a good idea to have someone check your home on a regular basis while you are away.

What do I do if my sewer backs up?

If you are experiencing a backup in your service line, you may obtain a plumbing snake from the Public Services Dept. during regular business hours at 403-548-9253. Alternately, you may contact a plumber or drain cleaning contractor to clear the blockage. If the blockage occurs in your service line on your property it is the homeowner's responsibility to clear and repair the blockage. If you suspect a blockage in the main line in the street, you should contact the Public Services Department at 403-548-9253 during regular business hours or the Town of Redcliff After Hours Emergency Number at 403-502-8836.

For more detailed information please refer to the Town of Redcliff Sanitary Sewer Blockage Policy No. 035 (2017).

How is my water bill determined?

Your water bill is made up of three components; administration fee, capital component fee, and your physical consumption. The administration fee covers water plant operations, water distribution operations, and administration. The capital component covers the physical cost to provide potable water to residents. Both the administrative and capital components are fixed fees. The consumption cost varies based off the volume of water your household consumes.

If you feel your consumption is high, there are ways to reduce costs. These include reduced lawn or garden watering, low flow shower heads, low volume flush toilets, reduce the amount of time your sink is running, go to a car wash instead of washing at home, install a rain barrel, wash dishes by hand, and check your house fixtures for any possible leaks. Even a small leak such as a dripping faucet can amount to a large volume of water consumed over a billing period.

In the Town of Redcliff our proximity to the coulees and prairies provides us an abundance of wildlife in our parks, streets, and even at our doorsteps in our back yards. Town of Redcliff Bylaw and RCMP field several calls each month regarding problems with deer, moose, coyote, skunk or various other form of wildlife. These animals have made their home in our coulees and sometimes in our parks. Some of these animals may be safely enjoyed at a distance. Remember, do not feed wildlife! If you have a bird feeder clean up under it, it may attract unwanted guests such as deer or a skunk. Also, clean up garbage and untidy properties that may attract rodents!

The sight of a deer and her fawns are beautiful to see, however should you get too close – especially with your dog, the deer now may see you as a threat. Never put yourself in danger when you deal with wild animals! They are not the fuzzy cartoon characters we have grown up with. If bothered some of these animals can become a danger to you, your family, or your pets. We must use caution when we come upon any wildlife, cross the road, use an alternative route, and report a wild animal if you feel there is a danger. Give them their space, even the coyote has its place amongst us; they assist in controlling rodents in the fields and parks.


