QUESTIONS SUBMITTED BY RESIDENTS

Currently the golf course is a viable organization. Future support should be evaluated and equivalent to what the town would provide other organizations in similar situations.

Ideas for a recycling station in Redcliff and ways to make our landfill less expensive for residents.	A recycling depot has been approved by council. The new depot will be just off Mitchell Street north of Broadway Avenue.
Running a municipality is very much like running a business; what is your experience in dealing with business financials or non profit organizations?	I have experience as a member of the Redcliff School Board, a member of the Redcliff town council and have been active in many non profit organizations including the Redcliff Library, Knights of Columbus, the Redcliff Senior Centre, and Church Council. My business experience includes owning my own business and as a car salesman.
	Collectively my experience has taught me the importance of balancing a budget, negotiating priorities and making difficult decisions.
What will be done at the intersection of Mitchell and Broadway?	This is a key intersection in our town and one that I feel needs to be addressed. Studies have been completed and council needs to make a decision.
