What are your plans for speed restrictions in Redcliff	We need better enforcement. Speeding along Broadway and Main St along with playground and school zones continues to be a safety hazard. I personally think the speed limit in town should be reduced to 40 as it literally takes 5 minutes from one site of town to the other. This is something I would work with council to solve
What is your position on municipal financial support for the Redcliff Golf Course?	I believe the town should not be financially supporting the golf course or any private business with loans. Although they have made payments and are likely to pay off the full loan. This type of action by council should be sent to a plebiscite. We need the community input before loaning any entity. I also believe if the golf course closed, it would lower property values in the area and be one less amenity. I would way the pros and cons before any commitment.
Ideas for a recycling station in Redcliff and ways to make our landfill less expensive for residents.	Recycle Station-The only item to recycle right now is Cardboard. The mixed recycle is a waste of money as there is nowhere to

	process and recycle plastics. As far as I am aware, most Alberta Plastics are landfilled. A cardboard recycle location would benefit all in town and reduce landfill use. Cardboard could be sold and generate a small profit. As for the landfill, I feel we need to look at keeping rates low for residents but also need to charge fair market rates due to the costs associated with operating, maintaining, and planning for cell closures and creation of new landfill expansion.
Running a municipality is very much like running a business; what is your experience in dealing with business financials or non profit organizations?	My current and past jobs combined with my education in law, business administration and financial services has given me the experience to understand and interpret financials. I have also been a director on a non-profit organization with a shoe string budget. Running a municipality requires financial understanding of how government works, where funding comes from, and how to access federal and provincial money.
What will be done at the intersection of Mitchell and Broadway?	I would like to see a 4 way stop sign placed. I believe this would slow traffic down and make the intersection safer.
